

SITE UPDATES

National CCCM Cluster

Site managers are coordinating with service providers to update contingency plans for UN protection of civilian (PoC) sites across the country to ensure timely responses in the event of population influxes in response to insecurity.

Across all the sites, the expansion of water runways and repair and maintenance of drainage systems are underway to mitigate the risk of flooding during the upcoming rainy season.

Juba UN House PoC Sites (ACTED) *UN House PoC 1 and 3* 38,833

During the first two weeks of May, 74 displaced households, or 119 IDPs, arrived at the UN House PoC site. The new arrivals came from other parts of the country, as well as Uganda and Kenya. The families attributed their entry to insecurity and/or the high cost of living outside of the country. During the same time period, 40 households exited the site for other parts of the country.

Bentiu PoC Site (IOM) *Bentiu PoC* 119,139

To strengthen the complaints and feedback mechanism, IOM's camp management complaint desk referred 446 cases to the different service providers in the site; out of these cases, 188 have been closed.

IOM conducted basic leadership training for 95 women. The training covered leadership and administration, communication skills, presentation, time management skills, problem solving, decision-making skills, community participation and team building.

Bentiu Collective Sites (DRC) *Bentiu Collective Sites* 36,671

DRC and UNHCR, together with local authorities, allocated land that was given on lease by the state authorities to 320 persons with specific needs who were living in the collective sites of Bentiu and Rubkona. The state authority has asked all the IDPs living in the collective sites to move out.

The Kondial Radio 97.2 FM station, run by Internews, was activated on Saturday, 13 May, and is now broadcasting in the PoC site and the Bentiu town area. Kondial FM will be covering a radius of between 35–40 kilometres in the Beyond Bentiu Response. Internews distributed more than 1,000 radios to households that were living in the collective sites and the other village in Guit, Nhialdu and Rubkona.

Bor PoC Site (ACTED) *Bor PoC* 1,956

As a result of the recent insecurity in parts of Jonglei, more than 300 new arrivals entered into the PoC site between 7–12 May. The Bor PoC site population has been reducing since April last year, with less than 2,000 individuals before this crisis. IDPs are mostly coming from Urur County, while many more are stranded in remote areas. Due to limited space and shelter, some of the new arrivals are sheltering in one of the schools.

Malakal PoC Site (DRC) *Malakal PoC* 30,559

As part of improving communication with the community, the Danish Refugee Council (DRC) received 450 complaints from the IDPs. Camp Management is addressing each case, providing feedback to the concerned households and sharing or referring to other service providers as needed. DRC, UN Police and UN Relief, Reintegration and Protection organized sessions with community leaders to provide information on how the holding facilities operate and agreed to conduct a refresher session on the PoC site rules and regulations, tentatively set for 15–17 May.

Wau PoC Site (IOM) *Wau PoC* 179 *Wau PoC AA* 39,165

In response to the April influx of IDPs, CCCM and Shelter/Non-Food team teams are undertaking efforts to decongest of the general food distribution area, where most of the new arrivals have settled. Teams constructed 73 shelters and relocated 7,784 individuals while 77 exited with the intention of proceeding to other areas due to uncomfortable living conditions.

The community is preparing for an election for camp leadership, with candidates cleared by the camp administration. The International Organization for Migration (IOM) has prepared messages to inform candidates and voters about campaign rules and how to vote without creating disturbances among the camp residents.

Wau Collective Centers (ACTED) *Collective Centers* 23,244

On 4 May, 6,600 IDPs were evicted from the Episcopal Church of South Sudan (ECS) compound by government authorities. Many chose to relocate to Hai Masna area, which IDPs had previously expressed fears as being unsafe, with several hundred more opting to move into the PoC site.
