

SITE UPDATES

National CCCM Cluster

In alignment with the CCCM cluster 2018/2019 Strategy, the cluster through its partners finalized and completed its submission to OCHA for the 2018 Humanitarian Response Plan for South Sudan.

Wau Wau PoC **178** Wau PoCAA **31,856** Collective Centers **14,316**

PoCAA: In order to enhance site layout and access within the camp, CCCM dismantled 18 illegal structures constructed along camp roads. Decongestion exercise continued with a relocation of 31 households (170 individuals).

Collective Sites: As a way to prioritize safety and ensure dignity for persons with disabilities, CCCM relocated six households thereby creating space for construction of latrines for persons with disabilities.

Bentiu Bentiu PoC **112,140** Bentiu Collective Centres **1,924**

PoC: Following heavy rainfall leading to gully erosion, CCCM proactively engaged in the repair and maintenance of PoC roads. CCCM additionally revamped youth recreational activities by levelling the football pitch that was eroded by heavy rainfall in the past month.

Collective Sites: CCCM cluster in collaboration with WASH is supporting integrated messaging to the IDP population in collective sites by including messages on good hygiene practices with ongoing information dissemination campaigns.

UN House PoC UN House PoCs **38,448**

As part of the efforts being undertaken to resolve community grievances at site level in PoC3, camp management joined with partners and UNMISS RRP to identify common messages regarding the numerous service gaps highlighted in recent discussions with the community. CCCM will invest in Communication with Communities (CwC) as a means to ensure communities are kept well informed and engaged throughout the programming cycle.

Malakal PoC Malakal PoC **24,424**

To improve access and enhance safety in the PoC, CCCM in collaboration with UNMISS sensitized traders to stop operating along the road sides and in the process, illegal shelters used for alcohol brewing were demolished.

Melut Melut PoC **651** Collective Centers **26,492**

CCCM supported the GBV sub cluster to coordinate with partners, IDPs and host communities, the preparation for the celebration of 16 days of Gender-Based Violence campaign.

Bor PoC Bor PoC **2,545**

To proactively respond to the need for medical referrals in Bor, CCCM is supporting discussions led by World Health Organisation (WHO) with partners health, protection, UNMISS and OCHA to develop a comprehensive secondary referral pathway that will serve the PoC population as well.

Aburoc Aburoc IDP site **10,071**

CCCM in collaboration with local chiefs and IDP leaders identified and inspected the land that will be used to settle new arrivals. Bush clearance has been completed and CCCM will build two communal structures to house the new arrivals while other partners will compliment and try to meet the needs of the new arrivals.

Kajo Keji informal settlements Kajo Keji Sites **17,367**

Since the deterioration of security in the Kajo Keji area, there continues to be a lack of access by humanitarian actors to the 3 former sites of Ajo, Kerwa and Logo. Populations have moved from the three sites either across the border or closer to the Uganda side. There are a reported 2,500 on the South Sudan side taking refuge in Korijo IDP settlement with influxes expected. CCCM is working to coordinate assessments in the region in partnership with other actors who had previously worked in Liwolo sites
